2. Hazard(s) identification

GHS classification: Not classified as a hazardous substance or mixture according to the GHS / OSHA HCS 2012 based on currently available information.

This material is a research compound that has not been fully characterized toxicologically. The absence of a classification does not imply the absence of hazard. Handle in accordance with good laboratory practice.

4. First-aid measures

Inhalation: Move person to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, seek medical attention.

Skin contact: Wash with soap and plenty of water. If irritation develops or persists, seek medical advice.

Eye contact: Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes; remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

Most important symptoms/effects: No specific symptoms known; effects of overexposure have not been characterized.

5. Fire-fighting measures

Suitable extinguishing media: Water spray, carbon dioxide (CO₂), dry chemical powder, or alcohol-resistant foam.

Specific hazards: Combustion may produce carbon oxides (CO, CO₂) and nitrogen oxides (NO_x).

Protective equipment for firefighters: Self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions: Avoid generating aerosols; avoid skin and eye contact. Wear appropriate PPE (Section 8).

Methods for cleanup: Absorb the spill with inert absorbent material (e.g., paper towel or absorbent pad) and place in a suitable closed container for disposal (Section 13). Wipe the area and avoid release to drains or the environment.

7. Handling and storage

Handling: Use only in a properly equipped laboratory by trained personnel. Handle to avoid splashing and aerosol/mist generation. Do not eat, drink, or smoke when handling. Wash thoroughly after use.

Storage: Unopened (sealed): stable at room temperature; ambient shipping does not compromise the product. Once opened (seal removed): store refrigerated (2-8°C / 36-46°F), protected from light; do not freeze. Use within the validated period after opening.

8. Exposure controls / personal protection

Occupational exposure limits: None established (OSHA PEL / ACGIH TLV not assigned).

Engineering controls: Use with adequate ventilation; a fume hood or local exhaust is recommended when handling powder.
